Family Bible Study - Week 14
Hebrews 6:7-12

Read the text in the NKJV. Suggested memory verses: 6:9-10. In lieu of *memorizing* the verses, read the assigned text every single day for a week.

FOR ADULTS:

The main idea is: “We are convinced of better things concerning you.”

What is the connection between verses 7-8 and the context?

What will God remember in us?

We are to “show the same diligence” (vs 11). Connect that thought with the fruitfulness of well-watered farmland in verses 7-8.

Give some things in life that cause Christians to be “sluggish.”

FOR TEENS:

In what ways can we take responsibility for our own spiritual growth?

How would you describe the first steps toward becoming “sluggish” toward God’s word?

Do you know anyone who was strong in their faith but then fell away? What could / should they have done differently?

Give some elements from our culture that make it easier for a Christian to “fall away”:

Is there a difference between being a Christian *whole-heartedly* and just “going through the motions”?

FOR KIDS:

Vegetable gardens have to be fruitful in order to justify having them. What good is a Christian who does not produce fruit (see Gal. 5:22-23)?

Give some ways that you can “serve the saints”: Why does this make Jesus happy?

If we realize the “full assurance of hope” unto the end, as Christians, what is our reward?

FOR PRE-SCHOOL:

Is it possible *not* to change some peoples’ minds if they are doing something wrong?

Draw a picture of a garden (vegetables or flowers).

What can you do to “serve the saints”?

Keep a notebook with your “Hebrews” study notes in them.
