

“Hold Firm!”

Family Bible Study - Week 15
Hebrews 6:13-20

Read the text in the NKJV. Suggested memory verses: 6:19-20. In lieu of *memorizing* the verses, read the assigned text every single day for a week.

FOR ADULTS:

The main idea is: “God confirmed it by an oath.”

Whose faith and patience are you trying to imitate?

What passage is quoted in verse 13?

What is the significance of God swearing by Himself?

How did Abraham have to live before he could obtain the promise?

If God cannot lie (see also Num. 23:19; 1 Sam. 15:29), how does that apply to commands and threats in the Bible?

If we flee to Jesus for refuge, what will we receive?

List some ways Jesus has been an anchor for you.

FOR TEENS:

Whose faith and patience are you trying to imitate?

What does it mean that God could “swear by no one greater”?

Look up “immutability”. How does it apply to God’s counsel?

If God cannot lie (see also Num. 23:19; 1 Sam. 15:29), how does that apply to His commands and threats in the Bible?

The word “consolation” in verse 18 means “encouragement.” Consider these passages which use the same word: 12:5; 13:22.

List some ways Jesus has been an anchor for you.

FOR KIDS:

Who has a Christian faith you would like to imitate?

Have you ever told a lie? Think about the fact that God could never lie.

God swore an oath based on His own nature. Do you understand how *firm* that makes God’s promises?

How does the writer describe hope in verse 19. What does that communicate to us about God’s promises?

FOR PRE-SCHOOL:

Have you ever run so hard you wanted to quit, but you had not finished the race yet?

What do you remember about Abraham? The writer wants us to learn from Abraham.

God cannot *ever* lie. How does that apply to His promises? His threats?

Draw a picture of an anchor. Write “Hope” on it.

Keep a notebook with your “Hebrews” study notes in them.
