Family Bible Study - Week 2
Hebrews 10:6-10

Read the text in the NKJV. Suggested memory verses: 10:9-10. In lieu of *memorizing* the verses, read the assigned text every single day for a week.

FOR ADULTS:

The main idea is: "We have been sanctified thorugh the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all."

What passage is the writer quoting in verses 5-7?

Who is the author assuming is *speaking* the words (vs 5)?

How could the author (either of the OT passage or Hebrews) say that God had no pleasure in burnt offerings and sacrifices when *He* commanded them? What's the writer's point?

Which is more important, worship or obedience? (Pick one.) Why?

What is the main point of verse 9?

## FOR TEENS:

What do Psalm 40:6-8, Jeremiah 31:31-34, and this text emphasize?

Which is more important: worship or obedience? Jesus came to do God's will (cf. 5:8).

Why is it wrong to believe that we can be baptized and then for ourselves?

Again, if we are sanctified by the body of Christ, what use would the old law have for us?

## FOR KIDS:

If God does not take pleasure in animal sacrifices, why did He command them?

If God prefers *obedience* over worship, how does that apply to our worship as Christians?

The focus of the text is on Jesus doing the will of the Father. What did Jesus accomplish by doing the will of the Father?

What will we receive if we do our best to do the will of the Father?

## **FOR PRE-SCHOOL**:

How important was it for Jesus to obey God, the Father, in every God told Him to do?

Isn't it important for you to do all that your parents tell you to do?

Jesus sanctified Christians through the offering of His body, once and for all. What do Christians do every Sunday to remember that sacrifice?

Draw a picture of Christians taking the Lord's Supper.

If we are sanctified by the body of Christ, how do we remember that sacrificed body?
