Family Bible Study - Week 32
Hebrews 10:26-30

Read the text in the NKJV. Suggested memory verses: 10:29-30. In lieu of *memorizing* the verses, read the assigned text every single day for a week.

FOR ADULTS:

The main idea is: “There no longer remains a sacrifice for sins.”

What does it mean to “sin willfully?”

Rather than sacrifice for sins, what awaits those who sins willfully?

What other passages in the NT teaches that we need to proceed with discipline at the testimony of 2-3 witnesses?

If one turns his back on Jesus Christ, the writer says he has also done three things. What are they?

What two passages of the OT are quoted in verse 30?

FOR TEENS:

What does it mean to “sin willfully?”

Can it be possible for a sacrifice to have no meaning? No significance?

Can you think of an account in the OT where a “fiery indignation” devoured adversaries of God?

Why would someone die under the Law “without mercy?”

Can there be a “worse” punishment?

Notice the writer says one who receives a “much worse punishment” is “worthy” of such. What do you think of that?

If one turns his back on Jesus Christ, the writer says he has also done three things. What are they?

What is the Hebrew writer’s purpose in quoting the OT in verse 30?

FOR KIDS:

Have you ever *deliberately* disobeyed Mom or Dad? Would you deserve stronger discipline than *accidentally* forgetting to obey?

Why does God need to punish people who sin?

Why does God get really angry at people who do not respect and honor His Son?

Do your mom and dad think it is okay for you to punish your brother or sister when they do something wrong? Why not?

FOR PRE-SCHOOL:

What is the purpose of going to school? When you learn something new, what are you supposed to do with that truth?

Is it *more* wrong to disobey a parent or *more* wrong to disobey a teacher at school? If you had to choose between the two, which would you choose? Why?

Why does God get really mad at people who do not respect and honor His Son?

Draw a picture of the story recorded in Numbers 16.
