"The Origin and Content of the Gospel: Romans 1:1-7"

Memory verses: 1:1-2. If you can't memorize them, read them every day for the next week.

This first paragraph shows us the origin and broad content of the "gospel." We would summarize the first paragraph in this way: The gospel (ver. 1) was promised (ver. 2) concerning His Son (ver. 3), Who was declared His Son by the resurrection (ver. 4), through Whom we have received grace and apostleship (ver. 5), among whom you all are the called (ver. 6), to all those in Rome (ver. 7).
