"The Obvious Evidence of the Gospel: Romans 1:18-25"

Memory verses: 1:22-23. If you can't memorize them, read them every day for the next week.

The third paragraph highlights the obvious evidence of the gospel around us. God's wrath is revealed, in the gospel (ver. 18) because man ignores the obvious (ver. 19). His nature is evident in the world (ver. 20) but men have not glorified God (ver. 21), but have become fools (ver. 22) and changed the nature of God into something physical (ver. 23). So, God let man experience the results of his sin (ver. 24), who worshipped the creature instead of the Creator (ver. 25).
