“The Moral Implications of Rejecting the Gospel: Romans 1:26-32”

Memory verses: 1:26-27. If you can't memorize them, read them every day for the next week.

The fourth paragraph highlights the moral results of rejecting the gospel (ver. 26). If someone persists in sin, God will allow him or her to do so, but they will eventually receive the penalty of their error (ver. 27). Sin will not go unpunished (ver. 28-31); those who practice these sins, which have not been forgiven, deserve death (ver. 32).

ADULTS:

What is the broad subject in verses 26-27?

Give the word that Paul uses for homosexuality in verse 27:

Based on verse 28, why do people (including us) make the sinful choices they do?

Describe God's judgment, from verse 32:

TEENS:

What word does Paul use in verse 26 to describe God's view of those who practice homosexuality?

Didn't God make women for the "natural" use of men? And vice versa?

What will those who practice homosexuality receive in themselves for their choices?

Give the list of sins that men of "debased mind" commit:

What do those guilty of sin deserve (ver. 32)? Why, then, do people (including us) practice and approve such things?

YOUTH:

Does Paul say that women "marrying" women is natural or unnatural?

How should Christians respond to men "marrying" men and women "marrying" women?

Have you ever done any of those behaviors in verses 29-32 that Paul says are wrong? How about "disobedient to parents"?

What can we do if we are guilty of any of these?
